Thoughts from Pastor Paola...

I'm the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live. And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?" John 11:25-26



We are journeying from ashes to life, from death to resurrection. In one month we will celebrate Easter, a time filled with hope and joy. Easter is so much more than spring flowers, new clothes, bunnies, and chocolate, (even though we love all of that). Easter is the highest expression of hope because of these words that Jesus spoke: *I'm the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live. Do you believe this*? Nobody ever said anything like that. None ever manifested that like Jesus did, with his own life. This promise changes everything.

Nevertheless, our world brings daily to us images of war, hunger, hostility, injustice, and despair. Our lives and the lives of people we love are overwhelmed with illness, discouragement, disappointment, fear, failure, darkness, and grief.

It may be helpful to remember the context in which Jesus spoke his promise. It was not to a group of people having the best day of their lives. It was to two women, Martha and Mary standing by the tomb of their bother, crushed by grief and anger.

That is what is so great about Jesus' promise: by faith it allows us to see life in death; to live by hope even in despair; and to experience joy while in misery.

There is no other foundation for real hope.

His revolutionary promise is not just about heaven. It is already here and now. Right here we begin to see a glance of the new life and live in it. Right now we can see how God mends broken hearts, brings justice for the oppressed, and heals relationships.

That is the hope for today. It is about the man named Jesus who walked among us, died on the cross, and on the third day was resurrected.

Join me this Lent and Easter at Salem as by faith we grow in joy and hope.

#### **Outreach for Hadfield School**

A year ago, Salem received a start-up grant of \$2500 from WI United Methodist Foundation to support both student and staff needs at Hadfield School where the majority of students receive free or reduced lunches. Through the year, we were able to use the grant money to supply dry erase markers, erasers and cleaner for 22 classrooms, health room needs of Clorox wipes, Kleenex, and paper towels and Ziplock bags to make ice packs. We also provided underwear for those sent to the health room for a change.



For Hadfield's clothes closet, we purchased waterproof gloves, snow pants and other clothing items. We supplied 44 board games to be used for indoor recess or family nights.

All of these items were in addition to Salem's ongoing collection of snack items provided for children who find it hard to bring snacks. Through the year, over 2,200 snacks were delivered.

## Our start-up grant was renewed this year for \$1,665 which is 2/3 of the previous year's amount. To maintain the same level of support as last year we will need to find monies for the remaining 1/3 which is \$833.

If we do this, the grant has a possibility of being renewed in 2025 and funded at 1/3 of its original value. We are proud to be able to support children and staff in a neighborhood school in this way.



Salem has a long history of supporting the Hope Center which helps the needy with clothing, hot meals and financial assistance. Some Salem members may remember many volunteer hours spent 16 years ago helping to renovate the building on East Avenue.

In January the Hope Center found a new home down the street at 101 W. Broadway. This facility provides easier access to a clothing shop which has tripled in size, a more spacious dining area, a commercial kitchen, guest laundry and guest shower facilities. The \$2.5 million renovation is completed and the building is open for clients. Salem has pledged yearly support of \$500 for three years.
