The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. John 1:5

The assassination attempt of former president Donald Trump brought back in

front of our eyes the horror of violence. Violence cannot be justified in any way. And as the tension is escalating, so is our sense of anxiety and uncertainty. We are still a very divided and polarized nation, and that may lead us to become paralyzed or numbed. Many of us are already dreading the next 100 days as our country prepares for the next presidential election.

This of course is not new to human history. Even in the scripture we find reports of several acts of political violence (2 Kings). Political violence was an everyday affair during the Roman Empire around the time Jesus was on Earth. This is not new. What is new though is what the prophets announce: The King of all the Kings is coming, the Prince of Peace (Isaiah 9:6). He will bring a new light that no darkness will ever overcome. *He will govern with kindness, justice, and righteousness on earth* (Jeremiah 9:23-24). His Kingdom even though doesn't belong to this world is already present here and now.

So don't let paralysis and anxiety take over your life. Don't give up hope because even though political leaders are very important to this world, in the final analysis, they will not lead this world. We live under the kingdom of the King of all Kings and because of that we should not feel afraid or paralyzed. We are called to follow our King and just like him, do all we can to bring His kindness, peace, justice, and righteousness to our world, starting with our hearts, houses, our families, and our communities.

In his Kingdom, there is no room for any kind of violence. We need to repudiate not just the acts of violence but also the spirit of violence. No matter what your political stance is, I invite you to pray this prayer with me during the next 100 days:

Eternal God, in whose perfect kingdom no sword is drawn but the sword of righteousness, and no strength known but the strength of love; So mightily spread abroad your spirit that all people may be gathered under the banner of the Prince of Peace as children of one God to whom dominion and glory now and forever Amen



New books - Two from Salem authors!



Salem's long-time member, Bill Young passed away in March of this year, but left us a wonderful story of his life in Some Beginnings and Endings in My Life. It is amazing to read what this man accomplished in his 94 years on earth. His childhood memories really reflect the life of a country boy in the 1930's, and his adult life encompassed travels all over the world. It is a lengthy book but well worth the read! Our neighbor from New Perspectives, Ellen McFarland, who is a former psychotherapist, has written a book titled the Sacred Path Beyond Trauma: Reaching the Divine Through Nature's Healing Symbols. She uses mythology, stories from film and fiction, real-life examples, and her personal history, to reveal how healing trauma is possible using the resources at hand in nature. Prayers in the Night: For Those Who Work or Watch or Weep is a wonderful book based on the Episcopal liturgy of the prayer of The Compline. Tish Harison Warren explores themes of human vulnerability, suffering, and God's seeming absence. The book shows how we can find comfort when we lie awake at night worrying or weeping. The book offers a prayerful approach to the difficulties in our daily lives.
