Hope Center Meal Volunteer Opportunity

Friday, September 20th 5:00 - 7:00 pm

Salem will be serving the evening meal at the **Hope Center** on **Friday, September 20, 2024.** The Hope Center is located at 101 W. Broadway in Waukesha and serves needy residents of Waukesha County.

There are two ways you can be a part of this outreach to the hungry in our community.

1. We will need 4-7 servers.

Servers will arrive at 5:00 pm to help serve beverages. At 5:30 they will serve the meal and desserts.

Afterwards they will help with the cleanup by washing tables and sweeping the floor. (Children under age 10 can volunteer as long as there are at least 2 adults for every child.)

Clean-up is usually completed by 6:30.

2. We will also supply milk and desserts:

10 gallons of milk Cookies or bars for 70-80 people (These could be homemade or store bought.) *Food items should arrive at the Hope Center by 5:00 on September 20th*


